



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

From the Desk of the Vice Principal

It's the Silver jubilee year of Bunts Sangha's S M Shetty High School & Junior College. Yearlong planning for activities and the grand day of celebration were finalised after several brainstorming sessions. New initiatives and programs were being discussed. The school atmosphere was festive and there was joy all around. On one of these days, one of the teachers asked me, "Madam, Why did you choose to work here?" The answer to this question is always ready with me and I mused – When it was hard to be away from home! S M Shetty High School and its people have always given me the comfort of my home and that is why I am here and continue to be here.

The teacher's question took me into my reverie.....

I had come to Bombay in December 1996 for the very first time and was looking for a teacher's job in nearby schools. Though I was working in a firm in my area to while away the time, I desperately wanted to continue my profession as a teacher. Life in Bombay was hectic and I missed my native place and loved ones badly. In November 1998, I read about the school in Buntaravani – a magazine my neighbour subscribed and I read because no one in their house was fond of reading Kannada articles, whereas I would be emotional even when I saw a small piece of article written in Kannada. I applied and one fine day, I was in the premises for the interview.

I can still remember the day I stepped into Bunts Sangha's S M Shetty High School. The main gate was getting constructed and I had to come in through a side opening. I was not that excited because of my previous experiences in nearby schools with regards to the infrastructure, space in the classrooms and location of the schools which I had visited. Schools in my hometown were huge and extended to acres of land and I could not digest the fact that schools could be built vertically and surprisingly inside housing societies. But as I entered the interview room I was charged up. There were three men to conduct the interview, whom I now recognise as Shri B R Shetty, C A Shankar B Shetty and Shri B M Shetty. As I entered the room, I heard them conversing in tulu and I felt very comfortable. When I went home that day, I had forgotten what questions were asked and what I had answered but I somehow knew and felt very positive about the place, feeling confident that I would be selected. As a member of the interview committee now, we do ask the question to most of the candidates as to why do they want to work here- We get to hear different answers like – the school ground, the building, references from our employees and students and so on....but I was here because it gave me the feeling of my home, my native language and its culture and till today the school and its people make me forget my first home.

When I joined in June 1999, school had students and teachers. It was a building of two floors, with lots of space and an equally good organisational culture. I saw the school grow in length and breadth and I grew along with it too. From an ordinary teacher, I was transformed into an extraordinary human. As years passed, I took up different roles, different assignments, learning all the way. Thanks to each and every one who travelled with me during this journey.

My school is now celebrating 25 years of its existence. The two floor building has now touched the sky with its achievements and good work. It has branched, grown wings and is now known as the Bunts Sangha's S M Shetty Educational Institutions with many other facilities for higher education.

The vision of the management, purposeful leadership of the Heads, involvement of teachers, work-centred environment, consistency in results, involvement of stake holders, high expectations, a supportive learning environment and work culture are some of the reasons why our institution stands tall today.
